## **Danish Pastry**

As I opened my cookbook on Swedish Baking, Gunvor La Cour's recipe for Danish Pastry fell out. Enjoy!

Warm: Filling:

1 cup milk 5 Tbsp. margarine

3 Tbsp. margarine 1 cup sugar

1 Tbsp. sugar 1 Tbsp. almond extract

Dash of salt

Cool until lukewarm: add 1 package dry yeast and let sit until dissolved. Add 1 egg, slightly beaten, then  $2-2 \frac{1}{2}$  cups flour; stir lightly handling as little as possible

Roll out and layer ½ of dough with 2 sticks of margarine, sliced. Fold and roll lightly, then fold and roll again. Cover and let sit for 5 minutes. Repeat fold and roll process and let sit for another 15 minutes. Cut dough in half and roll into desired length. Spoon filling down center of dough and fold each side to center to cover filling. Repeat for second roll of dough.

Butter cookie sheet and place pastry in oval shape around outer edges, or place in two long strips. Either way is fine. Beat 1 egg white with 1 Tbsp. water and brush over entire pastry. Sprinkle with about 3 ounces sliced almonds or walnuts and  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup sugar. Let rise. Bake at 375 degrees for  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour or until golden brown.

Now we are preparing for the Luciafest on December 11. We invite everyone who has children who would like to participate to join us at Gethsemane Lutheran Church for the rehearsal on December 5 at 3pm. As you probably know, we put the program together with one rehearsal on the week before the event and a final rehearsal on the evening of the celebration. On December 5, we will hand out the readings, practice the carols, and make sure everyone has the costume to wear. Meanwhile, the adults prepare special holiday treats to share with everyone. 


