Recipes Inspired by Laskiainen

In honor of the wonderful Laskiainen celebration that we just had, a recipe follows for Karelian Hot Pot, the national Dish of Finland. According to a wonderful website called "About Food," in 1939 and 1944 when Russia invaded Finland, all of the Karelian people left the eastern area for shelter with Finns who lived west of the new boundary. This resulted in a sharing of many recipes from the east with the rest of the country.

Karelian Hot Pot

Prep. Time, 20 minutes; cook time, 370

minutes

- 1 Pound of beef stew meat, chopped into 1 inch pieces
- 1 pound of pork stew meat, chopped into 1 inch pieces
- 1 pound of lamb stew meat, chopped into 1 inch pieces
- 1 Tablespoon of olive oil
- 2 large onions, peeled and sliced
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons of peppercorns
- 3 while allspice
- 2 bay leaves
- 3 cups of water

Brown the meat on all sides in the olive oil, over medium high heat. Place half of the sliced onions in the bottom of a crock pot, cover with $\frac{1}{2}$ of the meat, and sprinkle with $\frac{1}{2}$ of the salt, peppercorns, all spice and a bay leaf. Repeat layers. Pour in 2 cups of water, cover and heat on low for for 6-8 hours.

This is often served with mashed potatoes and cranberry or lingonberry preserves on the side. Perhaps more traditional to Laskiaian, is this dish, which is a a Finnish Oven Pancake that eliminates the need to prepare one pancake at a time!

Pannukakku

Ingredients:

6 eggs

1 ½ C milk

1/4 C sugar (optional)

1 T vanilla sugar or vanilla extract

1/8 teaspoon grated lemon zest

1 ½ C flour

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/23 C butter

1 C cream, whipped to stiff peaks

fresh fruit, fruit compote or sauteed apples



Whisk together eggs, milk, sugar and vanilla sugar (or vanilla extract) until creamy. Stir in grated lemon zest. Sift together the flour, salt and baking powder and stir into egg mixture. Allow batter to rest 30 minutes. Preheat oven to 450 degrees. When batter has rested, place butter in oven-proof frying pan. Place in oven to melt the butter without letting it brown. Then take pan out of oven and use pastry brush to coat surface and side of pan evenly. Pour in the pancake batter and return pan to oven. Bake 15 minutes or until puffed and golden. Serve with whipped cream and fruit. Serves 5-6
