Did you happen to see the PBS Nova program on June 10, 2021 on The Lost Viking Army? Around 865 C.E. a coalition of some 5,000 Scandinavian warriors landed in East Anglia. Guthrum, from Denmark, came to Reading during 871 to join them. They wintered 873-874, then Split in 2 groups. They intended to conquer Anglo-Saxon England. While they managed to conquer East Anglia, Mercia, Northumbria and invaded Wessex, finally they were defeated in 878 by Wessex's King Alfred the Great who rallied the Anglo-Saxon tribes together. Following a siege of his stronghold, Guthrum surrendered. He remained King of East Anglia. Under agreement and later under the treaty of Alfred and Guthrum, Guthrum agreed to become a Christian to his Christian vassals, while remaining pagan to his pagan vassals. The treaty set the boundary between their territories, and set conditions for peaceful trade. This treaty is viewed as the foundation of Danelaw over areas in northern and eastern England where Danes and other Norsemen settled. If you take a look at a map of that time, the Danes occupied a very large part of England! This map is from Wikipedia.
